Origin

Strizowice, Czech Republics, 1970.

Growth

In the beginning Sampion grows fairly strong, however at a later stage growth reduces or weakens. The crown is cone-shaped and has thick foliage.

Flowering

Sampion flowers in the mid-season, on one year old and on two year old wood. Largely self-pollinating, diploid. Recommended pollinators include: Golden Delicious, James Grieve, Idared and Gloster.

Productivity

Excellent and early. Bears fruit on one-year-old and on two-year-old wood. Slight risk on biennial bearing if inadequately pruned.

Harvesting

End of September, beginning of October.

Appearance

Medium-sized to large fruits. Smooth skin with a yellow-green base colour with a red blush, streaked.

Quality

The fruit flesh is creamy white and has a fine grainy structure. Sufficiently juicy. Weak sweet/sour and aromatic taste.

Storage life

Good storage life (in CA-storage up to March).

Details

Sampion is moderately susceptible to scab and cancer. Not susceptible to mildew and fireblight.
